Important events of April 14

- Firefighters Day
- •1434: The foundation stone of the world famous St. Peter's Cathedral of France was laid.
- •1563: The tenth Guru of Sikhs, Arjun Dev, was born.
- •1659: Aurangzeb defeated Dara in the battle for control of Delhi.
- •1661: Prince Sessie first used the term telescope for telescopes.
- •1699: The tenth Guru of the Sikhs, Guru Govind Singh, established the Khalsa Panth.
- •1809: Napoleon defeated Austria in the Battle of Bavaria.
- •1814: Napoleon was dethroned.
- •1849: The European country Hungary declared independence from Austria and elected Louis Kossuth as its leader.
- •1865: America's 16th President, Abraham Lincoln, was shot dead on this day at 'Ford Theatre' in Washington.
- •1891: Baba Saheb Bhimrao Ambedkar, the creator of the Indian Constitution, was born.
- •1912: The Titanic ship sank after colliding with an iceberg while sailing in the sea.
- •1944: A cargo ship, the Fort Stickin, docked at Mumbai dock, explodes at 4:05 pm, killing 300 people and causing (then) financial loss of about 20 million pounds.
- •1962: M Visvesvarayya, famous Indian engineer awarded Bharat Ratna, died.
- ●1981: The first spacecraft "Columbia-1" returned to Earth.
- •1995: India became Asia Cup Cricket champion for the fourth time.
- •1995: Dr. Ramesh Babu set a world record for holding 6,670 consecutive rallies in table tennis in Pune.
- •1998: The Treaty of Afghanistan was signed between the then Soviet Union, Pakistan, Afghanistan and America.
- 2000: The Russian Parliament ratified the 'START-2' nuclear arms reduction treaty between the United States and Russia.

- 2002: The Serbian leader facing trial in the International Court died.
- •2004: US President George Bush declared that Iraq would not be allowed to become another Vietnam.
- 2005: India and the US agreed to open their respective airspace to each other's airlines.
