- •1853: Boribunder to Thane passenger train service started for the first time in India.
- •1917: Rebellion of soldiers and formation of temporary government in Russia. Czar Nicholas II left the throne.
- •1919: M. K. Gandhi announced a fast to pay tribute to those who died in the Jallianwala Bagh massacre.
- •1948: Establishment of the National Students Union (NCC).
- •1972: Apollo 16 launched from Cape Canaveral, Florida.
- •1999: A ground-to-air Trishul missile tested at Chandipur, India.
- •1853: The first train in India ran between Mumbai and Thane.
- •1917: *Uprising of Russian soldiers in Petrograd.*
- •1919: To pay tribute to those who died in the Jallianwala Bagh massacre, Gandhiji announced a fast on this day.
- •1922: An agreement was signed between Germany and Russia in Italy, which is called the Treaty of Rapallo.
