Important events of April 2

- World Autism Awareness Day
- 1559: Jews were expelled from the Genoa region of Italy.
- 1679: Aurangzeb reimposed Jizya Tax to finance the spread of Islam on the Hindus. This Jizya tax was abolished by Akbar.
- 1849: British Punjab was established.
- 1851: Rama IV crowned King of Thailand.
- 1870: Poona Sarvajanik Sabha was founded. 95 members from different parts of Maharashtra assembled in Pune during its founding.
- 1877: Narottam Morarjee, great social reformer and the architect of modern Indian Shipping, was born at Porbandar.
- 1894: Coronation of Chhatrapati Rajarshi Shahu Maharaj.
- **1902:** "Electric Theatre", the first full-time movie theater in the United States, opens in Los Angeles.
- 1902: The first motion picture theater opened in Los Angeles.
- 1905: Rail traffic between Egypt's capital Cairo and South Africa's Cape Town city started.
- 1912: The ill-fated RMS Titanic began sea Trials.
- **1921:** Famous scientist Albert Einstein gave a lecture in New York City on his new theory of relativity.
- **1926:** The worst Hindu-Muslim riots break out in Calcutta.
- 1933: Sir Ranjitsinhji Vibhaji "Ranji", Maharaj, jam saheb of Nawanagar and noted cricketer, passed away. He was referred to as "The prince of a little state, but the King of a great game". He scored 989 Test runs with a 1st-class avg. 56.
- 1942: Andaman Islands, U.S. Army Air Force Flying Fortresses, bomb the Japanese fleet.
- 1942: Congress rejected the proposal of Sir Stepherd Crips.
- 1942: Congress rejected the Cripps Mission proposal.

- 1945: Diplomatic relations were restored between the Soviet Union and Brazil.
- 1948: Defence Minister announces the establishment of the National War Academy in Khadakwasla, Poona.
- 1948: Communist leader S.A. Dange was arrested in Bombay.
- 1954: Nehru calls for a halt to the buildup of nuclear weapons.
- 1970: Meghalaya, an autonomous hilly state, was established after dividing the hilly areas of Assam.
- 1970: Privy purses and special privileges of former Indian rulers abolished.
- 1980: Raj Narain expelled from Lok Dal forms Janata (S) Party.
- **1980:** S. S. Grewal was appointed as the Cabinet Secretary of India. He held this office till 30-04-1981.
- 1984: Rakesh Sharma, the first Indian astronaut, flew from the Soyuz T-11.
- 1984: Astronaut Rakesh Sharma became the first Indian astronaut to go to space under the mission Soyuz T-11.
- 1989: Establishment of the ASUS Corporation.
- 1987: Indian Standards Institution becomes Bureau of Indian Standards.
- 1991: Asom Gana Parishad splits.
- 1991: Haryana Governor recommends President's rule.
- **1993:** *MP High Court quashes dismissal of BJP Government under article 356; the Centre decides to move the Supreme Court.*
- 1994: Governor Bhanu Prakash Singh dismisses Wilfred D'souza Government in Goa.
- 1994: Ravi Naik sworn in as CM.
- 1996: Tamil Maanila Congress (Moopanar) party registered and recognised.
- **1997:** A division bench of Mumbai High Court holds that a married woman of a joint Hindu family can stake a claim to her father's property.
- 1997: Sumita Sinha of Dhanbad, (18 years college girl) became a world record holder when a 3,200 kg Ambassador car passed over her.
- 1999: The summit meeting of the Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS) was held in Moscow.
- 2001: 37 police officers killed by Maoist rebels in Nepal.
- 2000: Guru Granth Sahib is a juristic person and can hold property, says the apex court in a judgment of "far-reaching consequences and great significance".
- 2007: A powerful tsunami hit the Solomon Islands.
- 2011: India won the Cricket World Cup after 28 years.
- 2011: After winning the first World Cup in 1983, India won the World Cup for the second time on this day.
- 2013: Seven people were killed in an attack on a power plant in Peshawar, Pakistan.
- 2017: American singer and songwriter Bob Dylan accepted the prestigious Nobel Prize for Literature.

• 2017: Prime Minister Narendra Modi dedicated to the nation the country's longest, Chenani-Nashri road tunnel in Jammu and Kashmir.

- 1805: H.C. Andersen, a Danish author. He is famous for his fairy tales.
- 1891: Tristao de Braganza Cunha, a prominent Indian nationalist and anti-colonial activist from Goa.
- 1898: Harindranath Chattopadhyay, an Indian English poet, dramatist, actor, and musician.
- 1902: Ustad Bade Ghulam Ali Khan, an Indian Hindustani classical vocalist, from the Patiala Gharana.
