Important events of May 10

- •1503: Italian explorer and navigator Columbus discovered the Cayman Islands.
- •1526: After victory in the First Battle of Panipat, Babur entered Akbarabad (Agra), the then capital of India.
- •1534: French sailor Jacques Cartier reached Newfoundland.
- •1655: British forces captured Jamaica.
- 1774: After the death of Louis XV, Louis XVI became the king of France.
- •1796: Napoleon defeated Austria at the Battle of Lodi Bridge.
- **1824:** The National Gallery of London was opened to the public.
- •1857: Indian Rebellion of 1857- In India, the first war of Independence began. Sepoys mutiny against their commanding officers at Meerut.
- •1857: In the first battle against the British in Meerut, about 60 kilometers from Delhi, the heroes of Bharat Mata working in the British Army killed 50 British soldiers.
- •1899: Execution of Mahadev Vinayak Ranade for murdering Dravidian brothers in Rand murder case.
- •1901: Sir Jagdish Chandra Bose, Indian scientist, in the hall of the Royal Society, London, which was packed with eminent scientists today on May 10, 1901 proved that "plants and animal have similar touch sense".
- •1905: Pankaj Malik, music director, was born.
- 1907: Swatantryaveer Savarkar celebrates the golden jubilee of the 1857 freedom struggle in London.
- •1909: Bellari Shammanna Kesavan, internationally famous librarian, was born.
- •1916: The Historical Ship Port Museum was opened in Amsterdam, the capital of the Netherlands.
- •1917: Ramanand Maru Amin, great novelist, was born in Baloor, Mangalore.
- •1927: Nayantara Sahgal, famous writer and social reformer, was born.
- •1936: Dr. Mukhtar Ahmad Ansari, great freedom fighter, politician, journalist and muslim leader, passed away.
- •1937: Unconditional release of Swatantryaveer Savarkar from Ratnagiri.
- •1940: World War II Hitler invades Holland, Belgium, and France.

- •1940: World War II Winston Churchill became Prime Minister of the United Kingdom following the resignation of Neville Chamberlain.
- •1940: Germany invaded Belgium, the Netherlands and Luxembourg.
- •1945: The Russian army captured Prague, the capital of the Czech Republic.
- •1957: Dr. Rajendra Prasad was elected President of India for a second term.
- •1959: Soviet forces reached Afghanistan.
- •1962: Marvel Comics published the first issue of The Incredible Hulk magazine.
- •1972: America conducted nuclear testing in Nevada.
- •1977: Jahangir Khan, famous musician, passed away.
- •1979: Indy Khabra, Soccer(Football) player, was born.
- •1979: Micronesia became a republic.
- •1980: The occupation of the Iranian Embassy in London ended.
- •1981: For the first time, a night cricket match was played in Bombay (now Mumbai).
- •1981: The first day and night cricket match of India was played at the flood-lit ground of the Wilson College Gymkhana (Bombay).
- •1982: Karnataka Kranti Ranga led by Devaraj Urs comes into being.
- •1985: 59 were killed and 150 wounded in Sikh attacks.
- •1985: P. N. Bhagawati was appointed Chief Justice of the Supreme Court.
- •1987: Nobel Prize winner Oscar Arias was sworn in as President of Costa Rica for the second time.
- •1992: Dr. D.S.Tyagi, Chairman of the Agricultural Costs and Prices Commission, was shot dead by suspected Sikh terrorists in Delhi.
- •1993: Santosh Yadav became the world's first female mountaineer to reach the world's highest peak, Everest, twice.
- •1994: In South Africa, Nelson Mandela was sworn in as President in a historic ceremony in Pretoria.
- •1995: 104 workers died when a train fell on a lift in a gold mine in South Africa.
- •1996: Congress Chief Ministers of Assam, Haryana & Pondicherry resign.
- 1996: PM P.V. Narasimha Rao and his Council of Ministers resign.
- 1996: Union Cabinet recommends to the President the dissolution of the 10th Lok Sabha.
- 1999: Tamil Nadu Government withdraws the controversial Prevention of Terrorist Activities (POTA) bill.
- 2003: President of Mozambique Alberto Faisano visited India on a 6-day visit.
- •2005: *India and Pakistan agreed to start Lahore-Amritsar bus service.*

- •2006: ISRO Chairman G Madhavan Nair and NASA Administrator Michael Griffin signed an agreement to put two US scientific instruments on India's Chandrayaan 1 to be sent to the moon.
