Important events of May 15

- International Day Of Families
- •1610: The Parliament of Paris appointed Louis XIII as King of France.
- •1718: The world's first machine gun was patented by James Puckle.
- •1729: Khanderao Dabhade, great warrior in Maratha kingdom, passed away.
- •1730: Robert Walpole became the first Prime Minister of the United Kingdom.
- •1796: French troops captured Milan.
- •1811: Paraguay declared independence from Spain.
- •1817: Maharshi Devendranath Tagore, Bengali social reformer and father of Rabindranath Tagore, was born.
- •1836: Francis Bailey, a scientist, first observed the Belize beads that appear before the eclipse of the solar eclipse.
- •1864: Mahavirprasad Dvivedi, famous Hindi litterateur, poet, writer and editor, was born at Daulatpur village in UP.
- •1873: The proposal to dissolve the East India Company was passed in England.

- •1998: Pandit Ravi Shankar, Sitar maestro, receives the 1998 Polar music award.
- 1998: The Soviet Union started withdrawing its 1 lakh 15 thousand soldiers from Afghanistan.
- •1999: The Kuwaiti government granted women the right to vote in parliamentary elections.
- •1999: Militants gun down Abdul Ahad Kar, a senior member of the Jammu and Kashmir Assembly belonging to the ruling National Conference, in Kupwara district.
- •1999: The BJP and at least 13 of its allies rename themselves the National Democratic Alliance.
- 2000: Ghulam Hassan Bhat, Jammu and Kashmir Minister of State for Power, dies in a powerful IED explosion near Mandipore in Anantnag.
