Important events of May 16

- •1877: The political crisis in France began on 16 May.
- •1911: Pumping Station of Calcutta was commissioned at Tallah.
- •1926: Manik Varma, famous singer, was born.
- •1929: The Hollywood Academy of Motion Picture, Arts and Sciences held its first film commemoration ceremony. These awards were later named Oscars.
- •1929: The first Academy Awards were given in Hollywood.
- •1932: Hundreds die in fighting between Muslims and Hindus at Bombay.
- •1933: Shani, writer of novel 'Kalajal' and film 'Shaukin', was born.
- •1945: Prahraj Gopalchandra, modern author of Odia language, passes away.
- •1946: Gandhi's Cabinet Mission announces Plan.
- •1960: International Telex Service between India and U.K. started.
- •1969: Soviet Russia's Venera-5 unmanned spacecraft landed on Venus.
- •1975: Sikkim High Court was established at Gangtok for Sikkim territory.
- •1975: Sikkim annexed the principality and was declared as the 22nd state of the Indian Union.
- •1975: Junko Tabei of Japan became the first woman to climb Mount Everest.
- •1986: V. Shantaram, 75, was chosen for the Dada Saheb Phalke award.
- •1991: Queen Elizabeth II of the United Kingdom addressed a joint session of theUnited States Congress. She is the first British monarch to address the U.S. Congress.
- •1993: The first female Indian expedition led by Bachendri Pal honored 18 climbers, including seven girls, to climb Everest, setting a new world record.
- •1994: Phani Mujumdar, veteran film producer and director, passed away.
- •1995: Government of India decides not to extend the validity of TADA Act.
- •1996: Atal Krishna Behari Vajpayee, leader of Bharatiya Janata Party, becomes the 10th Prime Minister for 13 days (from May 16, 1996 to May 28, 1996 [technically till 01-06-1996]), although his ability to govern effectively is in doubt.
- •1996: Atal Bihari Vajpayee took over as the 10th Prime Minister of India. However, due to a lack of support, his government lasted only 13 days.

- •1998: India rejects China's charges on N-tests.
- •1999: Senior Congress leaders oppose Sonia Gandhi as Prime Minister.
- 2000: To make badminton more popular and to facilitate television broadcasting of the game, it decided to increase the game by 7 points instead of 15 at the meeting of the International Badminton Federation in Kuala Lumpur. However, this rule was changed again in 2006.
- •2004: Roger Federer won the Hamburg Masters title.
- •2005: Women gained the right to vote for the first time in Kuwait.
- 2006: Famous Hollywood actress Naomi Watts, nominated for the Oscar award, was made the ambassador of the United Nations. 47-year-old Mark Inglis of New Zealand became the first mountaineer to hoist the flag on the peak of Everest with the help of artificial legs.
- •2007: Nicolas Sarkozy's term as President began on 16 May 2007.
- 2008: The Supreme Court in 2008 overturned the Calcutta High Court decision banning 27% OBC quota in postgraduate courses in central educational institutions.
- •2008: Prime Minister Manmohan Singh arrives in Thimphu on a two-day visit to Bhutan in 2008.
- •2010: PTI Azlan Shah Cup Hockey Tournament: Defending champions India and South Korea were declared joint winners in 2010 after the match was abandoned due to rain.
- •2010: In the final match of the 20-20 World Cup held in West Indies, England achieved Australia's target of 147 runs by losing three wickets and became the world champion for the first time.
- •2010: six passengers and two crew members died when an Antonov An-28 plane crashed shortly after takeoff from Godo Olo Airport in eastern Suriname.
- •2013: American scientists for the first time succeeded in extracting stem cells i.e. original cells from cloned human embryo.
- •2014: Rustomji Modi was a member of the Tata Group and former Chairman and Managing Director of Tata Steel.
- •2014: An explosion occurred in Nairobi in which about 12 people died.

- •1825: Kerunana Laxman Chhatre, an Indian mathematician.
- •1831: David Edward Hughes, a British-American inventor, practical experimenter, and professor.
- •1857: R.N. Mudholkar was an Indian politician who served as the President of the Indian National Congress for a period.
- •1926: Manik Varma, an Indian classical singer.
- •1931: Indian politician and scholar, former Foreign Minister, Government of India Natwar Singh was born.
- •1933: Famous litterateur Gulsher Khan Shani was born.
