Important events of May 17

- •1498: Admiral Dom Vasco-da-Gama (c.1469-1524)-I, Portuguese navigator, arrived in India. He sailed around the Cape of Good Hope to Calicut, Kerala with three vessels and was the first Westerner to sail to India from Europe.
- •1540: Sher Shah defeated Humayun for the second time at Hardoi in U.P. in the battle of Kanauj.
- 1775: Marathas were badly mauled in the battle of Arras by Col. Keating in the first Anglo Maratha war.
- •1756: Britain declared war on France.
- •1769: The East India Company imposed several restrictions on weavers to ruin Bengal's textile industry.
- •1792: *Establishment of the New York Stock Exchange.*
- •1857: Bahadur Shah II became the Mughal emperor.
- •1865: Raobahadur Govind Sakharam Sardesai `Riyasatkar' was born.
- **1865:** The celebration of World Communication Day started.
- •1873: Hindi daily 'Bharat Mitra' started from Calcutta.
- •1887: Ranglal Bandopadhyay, Bengali poet, essay-writer and journalist, passed away.
- •1897: Dhirendra Varma, famous linguist, was born.
- •1916: Gurusiddappa Sivappa, great industrialist, was born at Bangalore.
- •1927: A.N. Radhakrishnan, a great educationist, was born.
- •1949: India decided with only one dissent vote to remain within the Commonwealth of Nations.
- •1957: Nehru, who went to Ceylon to celebrate the 2,500th anniversary of the founding of Buddhism, calls for an end to nuclear tests.
- •1970: Thor Heyerdahl started his journey from Morocco on this day and crossed the Atlantic Ocean in 57 days.

- •1974: Durgadas, a famous Indian journalist, passed away.
- •1975: Japanese woman Mrs. Junko Tabei became the first woman to climb Mount Everest.
- •1976: 4 Indians successfully skied down from the slope of Trishul peak.
- •1980: V. S. Kumar Anandan sets the record of balancing on one foot for continuous 33 hrs.
- •1987: Sunil Gavaskar retired from Test cricket.
- •1990: Homosexuality was removed from the list of psychiatric disorders by the World Health Organization.
- •1991: Prabhakar Machve, great litterateur, passed away.
- •1992: Import of 106 life-saving drugs and 37 equipment allowed.
- •1992: R. Venkataraman, President, leaves for a six-day visit to China.
- •1993: Ravi Naik, Goa CM, resigns; Dy. CM Wilfred D'Souza elected to succeed.
- •1993: Visiting Israeli Foreign Minister Shimon Peres signs an MOU with his Indian counterpart to end nearly 4 decades of inactivity in bilateral relations.
- •1994: Nar Bahadur Bhandari voted out in Sikkim; Sikkim Sangram Parishad leader Sanchaman Limboo takes over as CM.
- •1995: Three North Eastern States remove restricted area permits (RAP).
- •1996: Four members (Sange Sherpa, Hira Ram, Tashi Ram, Nadre Sherpa) of the Indo-Tibetan Border Police expedition climbs Mount Everest from the Chinese side.
- •1996: Rusi Modi, cricketer (736 runs in 10 post-war Tests for India), passed away.
- •1997: Two workers belonging to Mamsapuram near Srivilliputhur "burnt alive" at neighboring Idayankulam by its residents who took them hostage.
- •1998: US President Bill Clinton wants India and Pakistan to sign the CTBT.
- •1999: Sonia Gandhi resigns as Congress president but the CWC(I) rejects it.
- **2000:** The Union Cabinet clears a proposal for setting up a new appellate tribunal for foreign exchange following the repeal of the FERA and the enactment of FEMA in its place.
- 2000: The Federalists, the upper house of the Russian Parliament, approved the Nuclear Test Ban Treaty.
- 2002: The body of American journalist Daniel Pearl, who was killed in Pakistan, was recovered from a graveyard.
- 2004: The first legal same-sex marriages in the U.S. were performed in the state of Massachusetts.
- 2007: The fourth round of India-Pakistan Composite Dialogue began in Rawalpindi.
- 2008: Bihar Transport Minister Ramanand Pratap Singh resigned from Nitish cabinet.
- 2008: Taliban militants released Pakistani ambassador Tariq Azizuddin.
- 2010: Indian boxers won all six gold medals at the Commonwealth Boxing Championships.
- •2010: Promoting the country's oldest traditional sport Kabaddi, the Punjab Government announced to organize the Kabaddi World Cup.
