### **Important events of May 19**

- •1536: Anne Boleyn, the wife of King Henry VIII of England, was beheaded for adultery.
- •1571: Miguel Lopez de Zagazpi founded Manila, the capital of the Philippines.
- •1743: Jean-Pierre Christine developed a centigrade temperature scale.
- •1792: Russian army enters Poland.
- •1796: Game protection law restricts encroachment on Indian hunting grounds.
- •1848: The world's first department store opened.
- •1892: Well-known playwright and poet Oscar Wilde was released from prison.
- •1900: The world's largest rail tunnel at that time opened for simple passengers.
- 1904: Jamshedji Nusserwanji Tata, famous industrialist and father of modern technology, passed away at Nauheim, Hesse-Nassau, France. He commenced cotton mills in Mumbai and Nagpur and founded the Tata Iron and Steel Company, which is one of the largest integrated steel mills in the world.
- •1908: Manik Bandopadhyay, modern Bengali novelist and story-writer, was born.
- •1911: K.N. Vaswani, educationist and Journalist, was born at Hyderabad, Sind.
- •1913: Neelam Sanjiva Reddy, President of India, was born.
- •1926: Benito Mussolini declared Italy a fascist nation.
- •1930: White women gained the right to vote in South Africa.
- •1939: Russia and Britain signed the Anti-Nazi Pact.
- •1951: Sukhdev Bihari Mishra of Mishra Brothers, first historian of Hindi literature, passed away.
- •1953: State to control production and distribution of minerals involved in atomic energy development.
- •1954: The Govt. of India constituted a National Film Board.
- •1956: The Indian govt. bans six U.S. and two British films for presenting a 'disparaging' impression of life in Africa, including 'African Queen' and 'Mogambo' at New Delhi.
- •1969: Cyclone hit Andhra Pradesh claiming 608 lives and rendering 20,000 homeless.
- •1971: Indian Navy's first submarine station started at 'Veer Bahu' in Visakhapatnam.
- •1971: Russia started the Mars-2 program.

- •1975: Farm truck packed with wedding party run over by a train, killing 66 in truck, at 40 miles south of Pune.
- •1976: Australia legalized gold ownership.
- •1979: Pandit Hajari Prasad Dwivedi passed away.
- •1980: Dr. Ramashankar Shukla 'Rasal', famous writer, passed away.
- •1980: T. N. Raina, former General of India, passed away.
- •1982: Elections for Assemblies held in West Bengal, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh and Kerala.
- •1990: S. R. Bommai was unanimously elected President of JD.
- •1991: About 20 crore voters go to the polls in the first phase of election in 204 constituencies of the 10th Lok Sabha.
- •1992: Arjuna award for Tennis star Leander Paes and Hockey champion Jagbir Singh.
- •1993: Government decides to merge Vayudoot with Indian Airlines.
- •1999: Mahendra Chaudhary of Indian origin was appointed Prime Minister of Fiji.
- •1999: A volcano called 'Balkan Diffuso' became active in Mexico.
- **2000:** A `civil coup' in Fiji ousts the first ethnic Indian Prime Minister Mahendra Pal Choudhary. President Ratu Sir Kamisese Mara proclaimed a state of emergency.
- **2007:** The US Senate agreed to a comprehensive immigration reform bill.

- •1824: Nana Saheb Peshwa II, an Indian Peshwa of the Maratha empire.
- •1908: Manik Bandopadhyay, an Indian writer and novelist.
- •1910: Nathuram Godse, who added a dark chapter to the pages of Indian history by assassinating Father of the Nation Mahatma Gandhi, was born on this day in 1910.
- •1913: President of India Neelam Sanjiva Reddy was born.
- •1925: Malcolm X, an African American human rights activist.
- •1934: Ruskin Bond was born in 1934. He is one of the famous Indian writers of the English language.
- •1938: Poet, theater personality, story writer, playwright, film director and film actor Girish Karnad was born in 1938.
