#### **Important events of May 21**

- World Day for Cultural Diversity for Dialogue and Development & International Tea Day
- •1216: Prince Louis of France entered England.
- •1819: Bicycles were first seen in New York City, USA.
- •1835: Biharilal Chakravorty, Bengali poet, was born.
- •1840: New Zealand became part of the British Colony.
- •1855: Rani Rasmoni was consecrated at Bhavatarini Kali Temple of Dakshineswar.
- •1881: American Red Cross was established in Washington, D.C.
- **1881:** The US National Lawn Tennis Association was founded.
- •1904: The Federation Internationale de Football Association (FIFA) was established in Paris.
- •1908: The first horror film was celebrated in Chicago.
- •1923: Keshavrao Kothavale `Lalit', editor of monthly magazine, was born.
- •1924: University of Chicago students Richard Lobb and Nathan Leopold murdered 14-year-old Bobby Franks.
- •1927: Cargo Transportation service started between Kolkata and Bagdogra.
- •1927: Charles Lindberg completed the world's first non-stop flight across the Atlantic Ocean.
- •1929: India's first air cargo service commenced between Calcutta (now Kolkata) and Bagdogra.
- •1930: A raid of nationalists on salt works in Dharasana results in 630 casualties and the arrest of Mrs. Naidy, leader of the civil disobedience campaign.
- •1932: Amelia Earhart became the first woman to cross the Atlantic Ocean alone.
- •1935: Quetta earthquake takes a heavy toll of life.
- •1966: General Election (11th) of India ends.
- •1970: USSR conducted nuclear test.
- •1973: Mohan Kumarmangalam, Central Minister, passed away in an air crash near Delhi.
- •1975: The 26-mile feeder canal from Farakka to the Bhagirathi river dedicated to the nation.
- •1981: Pierre Moreau was appointed Prime Minister of France.

- •1984: Army moves in after 114 die in religious strife at Bombay.
- •1990: PM V. P. Singh cleared the Rs. 13,000 crore Sardar Sarovar Project over the river Narmada.
- •1990: Moelvi Muhammad Farouk, great Indian spiritual leader, was murdered.
- •1991: Rajiv Gandhi, Indian Prime Minister (1984-91), assassinated by human bomb explosion plotted by LTTE at Sriperumbudur in Tamil Nadu, 40 km from Madras, at 10.20 P.M.
- •1992: Manohar J.Pherwani, 58, Chairman of the National Housing Bank, died.
- •1992: China successfully tested a 1,000-kiloton atomic bomb. It is the most powerful nuclear explosion in the world.
- •1994: JKLF leader Mohammed Yasim Malik agrees to eschew violence provided the Centre guarantees a dialogue without pre-conditions.
- •1994: The Union Government imposes blanket ban on capitation fee for admission to private professional colleges.
- •1994: Sushmita Sen won the 43rd Miss Universe Award.
- •1994: Southern Yemen announced its separation from North Yemen.
- •1996: General Election (11th) of India ended.
- •1996: M.S. Sushama Dande (Shiv Sena) elected the first woman mayor of New Mumbai along with Savitri Patil (Shiv Sena) as Deputy Mayor.
- •1996: The famous soft drink company Pepsi announced making an advertisement film in space for the first time in the world.
- •1998: India declares a moratorium on nuclear testing.
- •1998: Resignation of President Suharto, who ruled Indonesia continuously for 32 years.
- •1999: A powerful bomb explodes and another is defused on the road leading to the Imphal airport minutes before the Prime Minister landed to commence his two-day visit to the State.
- 2002: Former Bangladesh President H.M. Ershad was sentenced to 6 months imprisonment.
- 2003: More than 190 countries of the world approved the International Treaty against Tobacco in Geneva.
- **2006:** Attack on Congress rally in Srinagar on 21 May 2006.
- •2010: Air India flight IX-182 coming from Dubai to Mangalore crashed, killing 158 out of 166 passengers.
- •2010: All India Gorkha League President Madan Tamang was murdered in Darjeeling in 2010.
