- World No Tobacco Day
- •1727: France, Britain and the Netherlands signed the Treaty of Paris.
- •1759: All theater programmes were banned in Pennsylvania, the northeastern state of America.
- •1774: The first postal service office was opened in India.
- •1867: Prarthana Samaj was established in Bombay.
- •1878: The US Congress reduced the circulation of the dollar.
- •1910: South African independence.
- •1921: The flag of the Indian National Congress was adopted.
- •1929: The first Mickey Mouse talking cartoon, The Karnival Kid, was released.
- •1942: World War II Japanese submarines began a series of attacks on Sydney.
- •1952: Establishment of Sangeet Natak Academy in India.
- •1957: Famous American playwright Arthur Miller was found guilty of contempt.
- •1959: Buddhist spiritual leader Dalai Lama was given refuge in India after his exile from Tibet.
- •1961: South Africa became a republic.
- •1964: The electric tram last ran in Bombay.
- •1966: a 17-year-old girl set herself on fire in protest against the regime in South Vietnam.
- •1970: A magnitude 7.9 earthquake shook Peru, killing at least 70,000 people and injuring 50,000 others.

- •1990: Lenin International Peace Prize awarded to Nelson Mandela.
- •1994: South Africa became the 109th member nation of the Non-Aligned Movement.
- •1996: Benjamin Netanyahu was elected the new Prime Minister of Israel.
- •1999: Adolf Tutor was elected President of the Slovak Republic.
- •1999: Krishna Prasad Bhattarai was sworn in as the Prime Minister of Nepal.
- •2001: The Commonwealth summit of former Soviet countries was held in Minsk (Belarus).
- •2007: Sepp Blatter became President of the International Football Federation for the third time.
- •2008: Government oil companies increased the price of aviation fuel (ATF) by 18.5%.
- •2008: In the absence of formal documents, former Pakistan minister Ansar Burney returned to Pakistan from New Delhi airport.
- •2010: A law was made in 2010 to reserve 25 percent seats for poor children in every recognized private school in India.
