Important events of May 4

- •1493: Pope Alexander VI divided the American continents between Portugal and Spain.
- •1715: The first opening and closing umbrella was made in Paris.
- 1780: The American Academy of Arts and Sciences was founded in 1780.
- •1783: Tipu Sultan was enthroned as the ruler of Mysore after the death of Haider Ali in a simple ceremony at Bednur. He continued the Second Mysore War against the English. He defeated many EnglishGenerals like Bright White & Col. Bailey. Tipu Sultan signed the treaty at Mangalore on 11th March 1784 A.D. which was known as the Mangalore treaty.
- •1799: Tipu Sultan, the ruler of Mysore state, was killed while fighting with the British at Srirangapatna in Karnataka.
- •1818: The Netherlands and Britain signed an agreement against the illegal slave trade.
- •1832: Darpan', a fortnightly magazine, started publishing as a weekly.
- **1846:** *The death penalty was abolished in the American state of Michigan.*
- •1849: *Jyotirindranath Tagore, Bengali litterateur and poet, was born.*
- •1854: India's first postage stamp was officially issued.
- •1854: The first stamp was officially issued from Calcutta where the first modern post office was established.
- •1878: Thomas Alva Edison gave a public demonstration of his invention, the phonograph, at the Opera Theater.
- •1896: The first edition of the Daily Mail newspaper in London was published.
- •1897: A fire in the Paris market in France killed about 200 people.
- •1923: *Mrinal Sen, famous film director, was born.*
- •1927: The Academy of Motion Picture Arts was established in America, which started giving 'Oscar' awards.
- •1931: Ataturk Mustafa Kemal Pasha became the President of Türkiye.
- •1932: Many are arrested as Congress agents picket Bombay post offices in celebration of Gandhi Day.
- •1935: Dalip Kaur Tiwana, great educationist and writer, was born in Ribbon village, Punjab.
- •1945: German forces surrendered in the Netherlands, Denmark and Norway.

- •1957: Rai Chaudhary Hemchandra, great historian, passed away.
- •1959: The first Grammy Awards were held.
- •1959: Nehru rejects proposals that India and Pakistan resolve their differences and set up a common alliance against Communist China.
- •1959: The first Grammy Awards were held.
- •1960: Washington, Ike signs wheat pact with India for largest U.S. food sale.
- •1975: Charlie Chaplin, star of silent films such as 'The Kid' and 'The Great Dictator', was knighted at Buckingham Palace.
- •1979: Mrs. Margaret Thatcher became the first woman Prime Minister of Britain.
- •1979: Margaret Thatcher became the first woman Prime Minister of the United Kingdom.
- •1980: Coal Mine Worker's Day established.
- •1980: Coal Mines Day was declared.
- •1980: Zimbabwean President Robert Mugabe won a landslide election victory to become the first black president.
- •1983: China conducts nuclear test.
- •1987: America's first bank was listed as a National Historic Landmark.
- ●1989: The American spacecraft FTS-30 was launched.
- •1989: Ashutosh Mukhopadhyay, famous Bengali litterateur, passed away.
- •1990: Supreme Court directs Central Government to set up a Tribunal to resolve Cauvery water dispute between Tamil Nadu and Karnataka.
- •1992: India and Russia sign a five-year agreement on trade and economic cooperation.
- •1992: Musician Bhupen Hazarika awarded the Dadasaheb Phalke Award.
- •1993: Income Tax exemption limit raised to Rs.30,000; Customs duty on certain drugs reduced.
- •1993: Santosh Yadav became the first Indian woman to conquer Everest twice.
- •1994: Fourth developmental launch of ASLV. 113 kg Stretched Rohini Satellite Series (SROSS-C2) was launched by the fourth developmental flight of ASLV-D4 from Sriharikota. This carried two scientific payload, a Gamma Ray Burst (GRB) experiment and a Retarding Potential Analyser (RPA). It is still in service.
- 1994: The historic agreement on Palestinian autonomy was signed by Israeli and Palestinian leaders in Cairo.
- •1995: The fourth ASLV-D4 blasts off from Sriharikota, successfully placing the SROSS-C2 satellite in orbit.
- •1995: Maharashtra Cabinet decided to rename Bombay as Mumbai.
- •1996: India won six silver medals at the World Weightlifting Championships, while N Kunjurani Devi won two.
- •1998: India is placed on the US Special 309 watch list.
- •1999: The first meeting of all signatory countries of the Ottawa Treaty to ban the production of landmines began in Maputo (Mozambique).

- •2003: Anna Guevara of Mexico set a world record in the 300 meters race at the Grand Prix with a time of 35.30 seconds.
- •2007: The meeting on global warming was held in Bangkok.
