Important events of May 5

- •1260: Kublai Khan became the emperor of the Mongols.
- •1479: Sikh Guru Amardasji, great social worker and teacher, was born at Basare village near Amritsar district.
- •1762: Russia and Prussia signed the Peace of Saint Petersburg.
- •1809: Mary Keyes became the first woman to be granted a US patent.
- •1818: Karl Marx, great journalist, chief editor, writer and social worker, was born at Trier, Germany.
- •1836: Europe's first railway line started in Belgium.
- •1883: Surendra Nath Banerjee became the first journalist to go to jail.
- •1903: Former minister William Petty declares Persian Gulf a part of British dominion in India.
- •1903: Tirupur Subramaniam Avinashilingam Chettiar, freedom fighter, educationist and politician, was born at Tirupur (Tamil Nadu).
- •1906: Ursula Jeans, actress (I Lived With You, Over the Moon), was born in Shimla, Himachal Pradesh.
- •1912: The fifth Olympic Games began in Stockholm, Sweden. Since then, the tradition of the opening ceremony and closing ceremony of the Olympic Games was established.
- •1916: Giani Zail Singh, President of India, was born in Sandhwan village, Punjab.
- •1919: The Red Cross Society was founded in Paris.
- •1922: Construction of Yankee Stadium began in the Bronx.
- •1926: Einstein's film Battleship Potemkin was first shown in Germany.
- •1929: Curfew was imposed in a bid to quell Hindu-Muslim riots that had claimed 21 lives in Bombay.
- •1930: Gandhiji was arrested and imprisoned without trial. As a result there was "hartal" (strike)all over India. Over 100,000 people were jailed before the end of the year.
- •1932:Prabhatkumar Mukhopadhyay, famous Bengali short story writer and novelist, passed away.
- •1932: Japan and China signed a peace treaty.
- •1936: Italian troops captured Addis Ababa.
- •1942: Henry Albert John Gidney, great leader and politician, died at New Delhi.

- •1944: Gandhi-Jinnah talks break down on Pakistan issue.
- •1944: Mahatma Gandhi was released from jail.
- •1946: Simla Conference in session from May 5 to May 12; Gandhiji's deliberations prove anfractuous.
- •1947: Gandhiji denies in an interview that communal division of India is inevitable.
- •1949: Jharkhand Party was established in India.
- •1951: The first computer designed for gaming was demonstrated in Britain.
- •1955: Indian parliament accept Hindu divorce.
- •1955: West Germany gained sovereignty.
- •1961: Commander Alan Shepard became the first American to go into space.
- •1966: Jan Congress Party was established in Orissa.
- •1971: India appeals for urgent aid for 1.8 mil. for Bangladeshi refugees in New Delhi.
- •1972: Lokanathan P. S., great economist, passed away.
- •1977: Chandra Shekar was chosen President of the Janata Party.
- •1980: The Iranian Embassy in London was liberated from some attackers.
- •1983: Keshavrao Kothavale 'Lalit', editor of monthly magazine, passed away.
- •1984: Phu Dorjee became the first Indian to conquer Everest without oxygen.
- •1986: Controversial Muslim Women Bill passed by Lok Sabha.
- •1988: The first television broadcast from the summit of Everest was made.
- •1989: Naval Tata, famous industrialist, passed away.
- •1992: Prithvi, India's medium range surface-to-surface missile, successfully launched.
- •1993: Balak Brahmachari, [Marxist Godman], famous Indian guru, passed away at 73 yrs.
- •1994: Revolt against Nar Bahadur Bhandari government in Sikkim, Sanchaman Limboo elected new Leader.
- •1994: The Labour Party defeated the Conservative Party in the local elections in Britain.
- •1998: Yashwant Sinha and Madan Lal Khurana, Union Ministers, are discharged in the hawala case.
- •1999: Rosane Prodi became president of the European Union executive.
- 2000: The Supreme Court permits former Tamil Nadu Chief Minister Jayalalitha (petitioner) to have herself and the others examined as "defense witnesses" in connection with the trial of the 'Colour TV scam case'.

- •2005: On this day in 2005, Labour Party leader Tony Blair became the Prime Minister of Britain for the third time.
