6. Bahraini militia claims drone attack on Israel

For the first time in the current war and for the first time in history, the Shia Bahraini militia Saraya al-Ashtar, backed by the Iranian Quds Force, claimed responsibility for a UAV attack in the Eilat region on April 27. This pro-Iranian militia was created in 2013, and its goal is to overthrow the Bahraini regime (the majority of the population of Bahrain are Shiites, the monarch and the elite that supports him are Sunnis). Unpleasant news for both Bahrain and other Arab Gulf countries, and, of course, for Israel.

8. Aafia Siddiqui's Defense Attorney in Kabul to Gather Evidence

This is a Pakistani neuroscientist who was suspected of involvement in the 09/11/2001 terrorist attacks and after mysteriously disappearing in 2003, she was arrested by the United States in Afghanistan in 2008 on charges of transporting explosives. She was sentenced to 86 years in prison for allegedly attacking investigators, which many doubted. Now her lawyer, Clive Stafford Smith, has reached Kabul to collect evidence.
