Important events of June 11

- 1770:** Great Barrier Reef, Captain James Cook discovered Australia.
- 1776:** A committee was formed to prepare the declaration of independence of America.
- 1866:** The Allahabad High Court was established, formerly known as the Agra High Court.
- 1901:** Pramathanath Bishi, professor and Hindi writer, was born.
- 1901:** New Zealand occupied the Crook Islands.
- 1907:** Shantilal Jivanlal Gandhi, famous Hindi writer, was born in Mehmabad, Gujarat .
- 1921:** Snehlata, social reformer and politician, was born at Mathura, U.P.
- 1921:** In Brazil, women were given the right to vote in elections.
- 1930:** A cyclonic storm blew a train off the rails near Himmatnagar, Gujarat, killing at least one person and injuring many more.
- 1931:** Purushottam Vishnu Behre, great editor, story and novel writer, was born.
- 1932:** Minu Modi, famous industrialist, was born.
- 1935:** Edwin Armstrong first broadcast FM.
- 1940:** Geneva Toron in Italy was bombed by Britain.
- 1940:** European country Italy declared war against the Allies.
- 1940:** During the Second World War, the Italian Air Force attacked the island of Malta for the first time.
- 1942:** The United States and the then Soviet Union signed the Lend-Lease Agreement during World War II.
- 1943:** British forces attacked Pantelleria, a small island located south of the island of Sicily in the Mediterranean Sea.
- 1944:** 15 US fighter planes attacked the Japanese base camp in the Mariana Islands.
- 1946:** Viceroy interviewed Gandhiji, and mooted the proposal of Coalition Government at Centre.
- 1947:** America's sugar supplies completely dried up during World War II.
- 1955:** The first magnesium jet aircraft flew.
- 1964:** As per the wish of the first Indian Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru, his ashes were scattered across the country.
- 1964:** Dr. Jayant Narlikar, great mathematician of India, submitted his thesis to Royal Society of London.
- 1973:** The Pennsylvania Justice Department approved a ruling that allowed women to get the license for boxing and wrestling.
- 1976:** Indira Gandhi and Brezhnev sign the Moscow Declaration of Friendship and Cooperation.
- 1983:** Ghanshyam Das Birla, great freedom fighter, social reformer, pioneer of Indian business, industry, and nationalist, died in London at the age of 89.

- 1984:** 574 Sikh army deserters arrested.
- 1987:** For the first time, Abbott, Paul Boateng and Bernie from the black community were elected members of Parliament in Britain in 1987.
- 1991:** Forty die in rioting in Srinagar, Kashmir.
- 1991:** Over 106.6 million voters go to the second phase of national polls.
- 1991:** Microsoft released its MS-DOS 5.0 operating system.
- 1996:** Narasimha Rao's name figures in fresh FIR on bribing JMM MPs case.
- 1997:** BSE sensitive index reaches 3927.
- 1997:** I.K. Gujral, PM, asserts that India had not deployed the 'Prithvi' ballistic missile anywhere in the country or on the border.
- 1997:** Jaspal Rana and J. Abhijit in the men's section and Nisha Millet in the women's section adjudged best sports persons of the National Games.
- 1998:** Chetak helicopter of IAF rescued a Border Security Force Jawan stuck waist deep in quicksand.
- 1999:** India provided incontrovertible tape evidence of Pakistan's involvement in the Kargil sector. The Indian army killed 23 intruders in the Batalik and Dras sectors but lost 15 of its men.
- 1999:** In the World Cup, former Pakistan off-spinner Saqlain Mushtaq took a hat-trick against Zimbabwe.
- 2000:** Assailants gun down 12 upper caste persons, including eight of a family in Bihar's Nawada district.
- 2000:** Rajesh Pilot, Congress(I) leader and former Union Minister, died in a road accident in his home constituency, Dausa.
- 2000:** 27 army personnel die after the bus carrying them plunges into a gorge at a spot 80 km from Jammu.
- 2002:** United States Congress acknowledged that Antonio Meucci was the first inventor of the telephone.
- 2003:** Kournikova was declared the most beautiful female tennis player in 2003.
- 2006:** The Nepali Parliament unanimously abolished the King's veto power in 2006.
- 2007:** Fiji's ousted Prime Minister Ladsenia Qarase was allowed to enter the capital Suva in 2007.
- 2008:** Former Prime Minister of Bangladesh Sheikh Hasina Wajed, who was jailed on corruption charges were released.
- 2012:** 80 people died in a landslide following an earthquake in Afghanistan.
