Important events of June 15

- •1215: King John of England signed the Magna Carta.
- •1381: The English peasant revolt was crushed in London.
- •1389: The Ottoman Empire defeated the Servants and Bosnians in the Battle of Kosovo.
- •1659: Aurangzeb declared as the Emperor at Delhi.
- •1667: Dr. Jean-Baptiste Denys conducted the first-ever human blood transfusion. He was a physician of King Louis XIV of France.
- •1752: Benjamin Franklin proved that light is an electromagnetic wave.
- •1762: The circulation of paper currency started in Austria.
- •1775: In the American War of Independence, George Washington was made the commander of the Continental Army.
- •1776: The first human blood transfusion was done by Dr. Jean-Baptiste Denys.
- •1785: In the world's first air accident, two French citizens flying in a balloon died.
- •1836: Arkansas became the 25th state of America.
- •1844: Charles Gutier patented the process of vulcanization of rubber.
- •1846: The United States and Britain signed a treaty regarding the border dispute between America and Canada.
- •1866: Prussia invaded Austria.
- •1896: 27 thousand people died due to the tsunami during the Sento festival on the coast of Japan.
- •1899: Roy Chowdhury Devipasad, modern Indian sculptor and painter, was born.
- •1907: Narayan Ganesh Goray, freedom fighter and socialist, was born at Hindala (Maharashtra).
- •1908: Stock Exchange of Calcutta was opened by Baldeodas Daduawala and Overened.
- •1909: Representatives of England, South Africa and Australia met at Lord's to form the Imperial Cricket Concern.
- •1916: President Woodrow Wilson signed the National Charter that led to the creation of Boy Scouts of America.
- •1917: Great Britain resolved to leave all the areas occupied during the Easter Rebellion of 1916.
- •1937: Kumar Shri Indrajitsinhji, cricketer (Indian keeper in 60's), was born in Jamnagar.
- •1947: The All India Congress accepted the British plan for the partition of India in New Delhi.
- •1948: Rajah Annamalai Chettiar, famous musician, social worker and Governor of the Imperial Bank of India, passed away.
- •1949: Ulloor S. Parmeswara Iyer, famous poet, writer, editor and literature, died. He was 72.
- •1953: Internal Air Route Corporation of India was established.

- •1954: On this day, Europe's football organization UEFA (Union of European Football Association) was formed.
- •1960: Burdwan University was established in West Bengal.
- •1960: 44 countries participated in the Second World Peace Conference held in Hague.
- •1960: Burdwan University was established in West Bengal.
- •1962: South Africa passed a bill providing the death penalty for many crimes.
- •1966: U.S. resumes full economic aid to India and Pakistan.
- •1969: Dr. Darashaw Nosherwan Wadia, great pioneer in Indian Geology and professor in development of geo-scientific research in the country, passed away at New Delhi at the age of 86.
- •1971: Britain's then Education Minister Margaret Thatcher proposed to end the scheme of providing free milk to children in schools.
- •1977: Spain held free elections after 40 years.
- •1981: Supreme Court rules that all children are entitled to public education regardless of citizenship.
- •1982: Argentine forces surrender to British forces in Falklands.
- •1982: Supreme Court rules that all children, regardless of citizenship, are entitled to public education.
- •1986: K. K. Tarapore, cricketer (Test for India 1948), was killed in a motor-scooter accident.
- •1988: Dalai Lama recognized the rights of China in foreign affairs and Army Operations in Tibet region.
- •1988: NASA launches space vehicle S-213.
- •1990: Punjab Government returned gold and other valuables seized from Golden Temple during the 1984 Blue Star operation to SGPC.
- •1991: About 50% of the 180.3 million electorate cast their votes in the final phase of Lok Sabha elections.
- •1991: General Election (10th) of India ends. In this election Indian National Congress won.
- •1993: PM Narasimha Rao visits Oman; India and Oman decide to give each other MFN status.
- •1997: Eight Muslim countries form an organization called D-8 in Istanbul.
- •1999: US gives permission to prosecute Libya for Lockerbie Pan Am plane crash.
- •2001: Shanghai-Five summit held in Beijing, Shanghai Five now becomes Shanghai Cooperation Organization, decision taken in 2001 to not give membership to both India and Pakistan.
- •2002: The meeting of finance ministers of G-8 countries started in Halifax (Nova Scotia), Canada.
- •2004: Nuclear cooperation with Britain received President Bush's approval. Former US President Bill Clinton's autobiography 'My Life' became a bestseller.
- •2005: Jamaica's Asafa Powell set a new world record in 100 meter sprint in Athens by taking 8.77 seconds.
- •2006: India and China decided to open the old Silk Route in 2006.
- •2008: Scientists of Oxford University observed the final state of big stars for the first time by exploding ultraviolet light.
- •2012: Nik Wallenda completed the tightrope walk over Niagara Falls and became the first man to achieve this feat.
