#### Important events of June 19

- •1296: King Louis of France issued an order requiring all Jews to wear a badge of shame.
- •1843: Karl Marx, author of 'Das Kapital' and sociologist, married.
- •1862: The U.S. Congress prohibits slavery in United States territories, nullifying Dred Scott v. Sandford.
- •1865: Union General Granger freed all slaves in Texas.
- •1910: The first Father's Day was celebrated in Washington.
- •1948: The Soviet Union closed the roads leading to West Berlin.
- •1961: Kuwait declares independence from the United Kingdom.
- •1966: 'Shiv Sena' a political party in India was founded in Mumbai.
- •1968: 50,000 people demonstrated for economic justice under the leadership of Martin Luther King.
- •1978: Garfield, holder of the Guinness World Record for the world's most widely syndicated comic strip, makes its debut.
- •1981: India's Ariane Passenger PayLoad Experiment (APPLE) satellite, 1st to be stabilized on 3 axes, launched.
- •1982: Hezbollah carried out a terrorist attack and kidnapped the President of Beirut University.
- •1989: E. S. Venkataramaiah became the 19th Chief Justice of India.
- •1991: The Soviet Union liberated Hungary from its occupation.
- •1996: Agreement on Intellectual Property Law (IPR) was signed between Cochin and the United States of America.
- •1996: Famous umpire Dickie Bird MCC was awarded Life Membership.
- •1999: The G8 summit began in Cologne (Germany).
- •1999: Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee inaugurated the Maitreyi Express to Kolkata to Dhaka bus service.
- •2002: Pakistan's Foreign Secretary Inaam-ul-Haq was appointed the Foreign Minister of Pakistan.
- •2003: Finland's first female Prime Minister Anneli Jäätteenmäki resigned from her post.
- •2005: Forbes magazine ranked Oprah Winfrey first in the world's 100 most powerful people.
- •2006: Japan issued a stern warning to North Korea on the nuclear test issue.
- •2007: Pakistan President Pervez Musharraf removed Mohammad Ali Durrani from the post of Information Minister in 2007. Pakistan was ranked 12th in the list of politically unstable countries in the world.
- •2008: the Uttarakhand government postponed the 480 MW Pala Maneri and 380 MW Bhairondhari projects under construction on the Ganga.

- •2008: A ceasefire agreement came into effect in 2008 between Israel and Hamas to stop violent conflict in Gaza Strip.
- •2012: The Supreme Court of Pakistan has declared Prime Minister Yusuf Raza Gilani, convicted in a contempt of court case, ineligible to continue in office from April 26.

- •1871: Madhavrao Sapre, promoter of national language Hindi, sharp thinker and freedom fighter, was born in Pathariya village of Damoh in 1871.
- •1922: Danish physicist, Nobel Prize winner Aage Niels Bohr was born.
- •1931: Former Governor of Uttarakhand and Sikkim Sudarshan Aggarwal was born.
- •1945: Aung San Suu Kyi, who emerged as a symbol of freedom in the world despite being imprisoned and under house arrest for many years, was born.
- •1947: Famous British-Indian writer and novelist Salman Rushdie was born.
- •1948: Indian politician and former Chief Minister of Manipur Okram Ibobi Singh was born.
- •1970: Indian leader and member of the Parliament of India, Rahul Gandhi was born in New Delhi.
