Important events of June 21

- World Music Day
- International Yoga Day
- •1576: The Muldal army defeated Rana Pratap Singh in the Battle of Haldighati.
- •1756: The British contingent led by John Z. Holwell surrendered to Siraj-ud-Daulah, the Nawab of Bengal. In a brutal incident that night, 123 British prisoners died.
- •1768: John Archer became the first American to earn a bachelor's degree in medicine.
- •1862: Gyanendra Mohan Tagore became the first Indian to obtain a law degree from 'Lincoln's Inn'.
- •1898: The United States defeated Spain and captured Guam.
- •1944: Berlin was heavily bombed.
- •1947: The Canadian Parliament unanimously passed a law to expel refugees from the country.
- •1948: C. Rajagopalachari became the last Governor General of India.
- •1949: Rajasthan High Court was established.
- •1957: Ellen Fairclough was sworn in as Canada's first female cabinet minister.
- •1963: Cardinal Giovanni Battista Montini was elected Pope Paul VI.
- •1975: The West Indies team had the honor of winning the first World Cup.
- •1977: Mustafa Bulent Ecevit formed the government in Turkey.
- •1991: P.V. Narasimha Rao became the ninth Prime Minister of India.
- •1998: India and Russia signed a \$2.5 billion deal to set up a nuclear power plant at Kudankulam in Tamil Nadu.
- •1999: Manmohan Singh became the Finance Minister of India.
- •1999: Demilitarization agreement between the Kosovo Liberation Army (KLA) and the Kosovo Peacekeeping Force
- •2001: Pakistan President Pervez Musharraf reinstated anti-terrorism laws in 2001, the US was upset with Musharraf's becoming President.
- •2002: Zamiruddin Sarkar became the President of Bangladesh.
- •2002: Meeting of the 15 heads of state of the European Union begins in Seville (Spain).
- •2003: JK Rowling's fifth book Harry Potter and the Order of the Phoenix was released.
- •2004: China supported India and Pakistan talks.
- •2005: Donald Tyng became the new Administrator of Hong Kong.
- •2006: Newly discovered Pluto satellites are renamed Nix and Hydra.
- •2008: Hundreds of people died in the Philippines due to the devastating typhoon Fengshen.
- •2009: India's badminton star player Saina Nehwal won the title of Super Series badminton tournament in 2009. She is the first Indian woman to do so.

- •2012: 90 refugees died when a boat going to Australia sank.
- •2012: The Competition Commission of India imposed a fine of Rs 6,000 crore on 11 cement companies, holding them guilty of price fixing by forming a trade cartel.
- •2013: A large number of people died in a bomb blast in a mosque in Peshawar, Pakistan.
- •2014: The proposal to celebrate "International Yoga Day" on 21 June was approved by 193 members in the United Nations on 11 December.
- •2015: International Yoga Day was celebrated worldwide in 2015 on the appeal of the Prime Minister of India Narendra Modi.

- •1912: Famous Hindi litterateur, playwright and story writer Vishnu Prabhakar was born.
- •1927: B.G. Verghese, a senior journalist awarded the Ramon Magsaysay Award, was born.
- •1933: India's famous writer, novelist, playwright, critic and satirist Mudra Rakshasa was born.
- •1953: Benazir Bhutto, who became the Prime Minister of Pakistan twice, was born.
- •1967: Thailand's first woman Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra was born.
- •1970: Indonesia's first President Sukarno was born.
