Important events of June 9

- •1659: Dara Shikoh was handed over to Aurangzeb's army by Jiwan Khan, a Baluchi whose life was saved by Dara.
- •1665: Treaty of Purandar was signed between Mirza Raje Jaisingh and Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj.
- •1720: The Third Treaty of Stockholm was signed between Sweden and Denmark.
- •1752: The French army surrendered to the British forces in the Trichinopoly region of India.
- •1789: Spain seized British ships near Vancouver Island.
- •1815: Luxembourg was liberated from French occupation.
- •1834: Dr. William Carey, great writer and social worker, died.
- •1866: Establishment of Allahabad High Court.
- •1898: China leased some new territories of Hong Kong from Britain for 99 years.
- •1900: Birsa Mudra, the freedom fighter, died in Ranchi Jail under mysterious circumstances.
- •1909: Baburao Arnalkar, famous detective story writer, was born.
- •1923: Idris Hassan Latif, Air Chief Marshal, was born at Hyderabad, Deccan.
- •1923: K. Alagirisami, famous journalist, playwright and story writer, was born.
- •1931: The Donald Duck cartoon was first featured.
- •1934: World famous cartoon Donald Duck made his theatrical debut with The Wise Little Hen.
- •1940: Norway surrendered to Germany in 1940 during World War II.
- •1941: An explosion at an arms factory located in the Fort Smederevo area of Belgrade, the capital of the European country Serbia, killed 1500 people.
- •1944: Russia invaded the Karelia region of Finland.
- •1945: Australian forces entered the North Borneo region in Brunei Bay.
- •1948: Laloo Prasad Yadav, former Chief Minister of Bihar, was born.
- •1949: Kiran Bedi, the first woman Indian Police Service Officer, was born in Amritsar, Punjab.
- •1957: General Election (2nd) of India ends.
- •1959: USS George Washington, the first-ever submarine to have a nuclear ballistic missile, was launched in the US Navy.
- •1960: Typhoon Mary that hit China killed 1600 people.
- •1964: Lal Bahadur Shastri became the second Prime Minister of India when the country was shocked of Jawaharlal Nehru's death and the Indo-China war. Shastri gave the quotation "Jai Jawan Jai Kisan" which motivated the war-affected Indians to boost their morale. He remained in this office till he died on January 11, 1966 at Tashkent. In his cabinet, Indira Gandhi served as Minister of Information and Broadcasting.
- •1967: Narayan Shripad Rajhans, alias Bal Gandharva, went into a coma in Bombay and never regained his consciousness.
- •1970: King Hussein of Jordan was shot.
- •1975: Live broadcast of the proceedings of the British Parliament for the general public started.

- •1980: M. G. Ramachandran's second AIADMK ministry takes office.
- •1983: The Conservative Party, led by Margaret Thatcher, won a second consecutive majority British general election.
- •1986: ICMR set up a network of Reference/Surveillance Centres for AIDS in almost all states of India.
- •1986: First AIDS death reported from a private hospital in Mumbai.
- •1991: A question paper was leaked due to which the Civil Services preliminary examination was canceled.
- •1991: Raj Khosla, famous film producer and director, passed away.
- •1991: Former England opener Graham Gooch played a memorable innings of 154 runs in 1991 and led his team to victory against West Indies in a Test match at home after 22 years.
- •1992: LDF wrests Narakal while the UDF retains the Tanur assembly seat in Kerala.
- •1992: Rajesh Khanna (Congress-I) defeats Shatrughan Sinha to wrest the New Delhi Lok Sabha seat from the BJP.
- •1994: Yogi Dhirendra Bhramachari, [controversial Flying Swami], hindu saint, died in an air crash near Jammu. He was 70.
- •1997: Portfolio changes were effected by I K Gujral in the Union Cabinet.
- •1997: At least 50 persons were killed and 5,000 families affected in a landslide triggered by heavy rains in Gangtok.
- •1998: Gujarat was hit by a cyclone killing 1,000 people in six days.
- •1998: 81 persons are killed as cyclone hits the Saurashtra and Kutch regions of Gujarat and Jalore district of Rajasthan. Subsequently, the toll is put at 934 in the Kutch-Saurashtra region alone.
- •1998: The rupee plunges to an all-time low of Rs. 42.23/25 against the dollar.
- •1999: The Indian army occupies two key positions in the Batalik sector.
- •1999: NATO and Yugoslavia signed a peace agreement in Kosovo.
- •2000: The CBI-designated court frames charges against Bihar Chief Minister Rabri Devi and RJD president Laloo Prasad Yadav in the disproportionate assets case.
- •2001: India's Leander Pes and Mahesh Bhupathi won the men's doubles title at the French Tennis Championships.
- •2006: The 2006 World Cup Football got off to a colorful start in Munich.
- •2008: The Union Territory Administration declared Chandigarh tobacco free.
- •2008: Film actor Shahrukh Khan won the Best Actor award for the film 'Chak De India' at the 9th International Indian Film Academy (IIFA) Awards ceremony.
- •2011: 6 women were arrested for driving in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia.
