Important events of July 12

- •1096: Crusaders led by Peter the Hermit reached Sofia in Bulgaria.
- •1290: Jews were expelled on the orders of King Edward I of England.
- •1295: Savtamali, famous saint, attains 'samadhi'.
- •1346: Charles IV of Luxembourg was elected ruler of the Roman Empire.
- •1489:Bahlul Khan Lodi, an Afghan and founder of the Lodi dynasty, died in Delhi.
- •1543: King Henry VIII of England married his sixth and last wife Catherine Parr.
- •1576: Husain Quli, the new Governor of Bengal, defeated the rebels and put them to fight. Daud was captured and put to death.
- •1673: A defense truce between the Netherlands and Denmark was signed.
- •1674: Shivaji signed a friendship treaty with the East India Company.
- •1674: The Maratha ruler Shivaji Maharaj signed a treaty of friendship with the East India Company.
- •1690: Protestants led by William of Orange defeated the Roman Catholic army.
- •1801: Britain defeated France and Spain in the Battle of Algeciras.
- •1812: American forces led by General Hull attacked Canada.
- •1823: The first steamship built in India, 'Diana', was unveiled in Calcutta (now Kolkata).
- •1823: First Indian Steam Engine Ship "Diana-a-Gunboat" sailed in the sea near Calcutta. It was built by Kyd & Co.
- •1862: The US Congress authorized the Medal of Honor.
- •1864: Vishvanath Kashinath Rajwade, great Historian, was born.
- •1879: The National Guards unit in Bulgaria was established.
- •1896: Digambarrao G. Bindu, politician and father of Hyderabad Liberation Party, was born.
- •1909: Vimal Rai, film producer and director, was born.
- •1912: 'Queen Elizabeth' was the first foreign film to be screened in America.
- •1918: A Japanese warship exploded in the Bay of Toyama. In which 500 people died.
- •1920: Yeshwant Vishnu Chandrachud, Chief Justice of Supreme Court of India, was born.
- •1920: Siddhartha Cherry V, educationist and diplomat, was born at Mysore.
- •1932: The 16,000-foot Shyok ice dam in the Himalayas bursts flooding the Indus Valley at Kashmir.
- •1935: Belgium recognized the then Soviet Union.
- •1943: Russia defeated the Nazis in the Battle of Prokhorovka in 1943, 12000 died.
- •1947: Pochiah Krishnamurthy, great Indian cricket wicket-keeper (1971 WI tour), was born in Huderabad.
- •1949: Dutch KLM Constellation crashes near Bombay, 45 die.
- •1949: The ban imposed on RSS after the assassination of Mahatma Gandhi was conditionally lifted.
- •1957: Sahajada Karim became Aga Khan.

- •1957: American surgeon Leroy E. Burney told that there is a direct relationship between smoking and lung cancer.
- •1960: Bhagalpur and Ranchi Universities were established.
- •1961: Panshet and Khadakwasla dam burst. Floods in Pune killed 2,000 people, displaced 100,000.
- •1965: Sanjay Vijay Manjrekar, cricketer (son of Vijay, Indian middle-order batsman), was born in Mangalore.
- •1970: Major flooding in the Alaknanda river resulted in the sweeping of buses and claimed 600 lives.
- •1973: A fire broke out in the office of the National Personnel Records Center of America.
- •1980: Congress (I) gets absolute majority in Rajya Sabha.
- •1982: Establishment of the National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD).
- •1985: P. N. Bhagwati became the 17th Chief Justice of India.
- •1989: Lotte World Adventure was opened in Seoul, South Korea.
- •1990: The then President of Russia Boris Yeltsin announced his resignation from the Soviet Communist Party.
- •1993: A 7.8 magnitude earthquake occurred in Japan. In which 160 people died.
- •1993: West Bengal Governor Dr. Nurul Hasan, 72, died.
- •1994: *India expels Pak diplomat*; *Indian attache tortured in Islamabad*.
- •1994: Palestinian Liberation Organization Chairman Yasser Arafat came to Gaza Strip after living in exile for 27 years.
- •1994: Vasant (V. P. Sathe), film critic, journalist, publisher and author, passed away.
- •1996: Bail granted to Harshad Mehta, prime accused in the securities scam.
- •1996: Lok Sabha adopts resolution extending President's Rule in J & K for 6 months.
- •1996: Ram Vilas Paswan presents railway budget 96-97 with 10% hike in freight and upper class journeys.
- •1998: France defeated defending champions Brazil 3-0 to win the 16th FIFA World Cup.
- •1998: India will not reverse the nuclear programme, declared Mr. Vajpayee.
- •1999: India sets a deadline for intruders withdrawal from Kargil, announces suspension of air strikes.
- •1999: Rajendra Kumar (71), legendary actor who acted in over 150 Hindi films, died in Mumbai.
- •2000: 67 persons died in a landslide triggered by torrential rains in Ghatkopar, a Mumbai suburb.
- •2001: India and Bangladesh started the 'Maitri' bus service between Agartala and Dhaka.
- •2003: North and South Korea agreed to hold talks on the nuclear weapons issue.
- •2005: Famous cricket umpire David Shepherd retired from international cricket.
- •2006: Israel attacked Lebanon after two of its soldiers were taken hostage.
