Important events of July 14

- •1223: After the death of Philip II, his son Louis VIII became the king of France.
- •1456: Hungary defeated the Ottomans in the Battle of Belgrade.
- •1536: France and Portugal signed the naval treaty of Lyons against Spain.
- •1636: Mughal emperor Shah Jahan appointed Aurangzeb as the viceroy of Deccan.
- •1656: Guru Har Kishan, the eight Sikh, was born.
- •1789: In Paris, citizens attacked the Bastille, a symbol of French state repression, and released seven prisoners.
- •1798: The US Congress approved the 'Sedition Act'. After this, writing, printing or speaking false or misleading things against the government became a crime.
- •1850: The first public demonstration of artificially (by machine) frozen ice took place.
- •1853: The first general elections in New Zealand were held.
- •1854: Mahendranath Gupt, follower of Ramkrishna Paramahans, was born.
- •1856: Gopal Ganesh Agarkar, great social worker, was born.
- •1861: An American man named Cot Ling made a machine gun.
- •1864: Discovery of gold in Helena, the capital of Montana state of America.
- •1867: Alfred Nobel successfully tested dynamite.
- •1900: The European group took back Tientsin from the Boxer rebels in China.
- •1914: The first liquid fuel based rocket design was patented by Robert H. Goddard.
- •1923: Iqbal Singh Bhatia, great educationist, was born at Kotla Qasim Khan, (Pakistan).
- •1927: The first commercial flight of an aircraft in Hawaii began.
- •1928: Bedabrata Barua, educationist, social reformer and politician, was born.
- •1933: In Germany, all except the Nazi party were declared illegal and the repressive policy began.
- •1940: In the Second World War, German bombers bombed Suez.
- •1942: Britishers Quit India resolution was passed by Congress Working Committee. They demanded departure of the British and agreed on passive resistance until India's independence. It was declared on 8th August, 1942 at August Kranti Maidan (Gowalia Tank).
- •1946: India grants Siam a 20 year, 3 mil. credit to increase export of Siamese rice.
- •1951: The first color telecast of a sports event in the form of horse racing was done on CBS channel.
- •1958: After the rebellion of General Abdul Karim in Iraq, monarchy ended and democracy was established.
- •1958: Uprising against the monarchy in Iraq. Abd al-Karim Qasim in power.
- •1963: Swami Shivanand Saraswati, religious leader, passed away.
- •1965: NASA's spacecraft passing near Mars took the first close-up pictures of another planet.
- •1969: 85 people died in a collision between a goods train and a passenger train in Jaipur.

- •1969: The US Finance Ministry and the Federal Reserve System announced the immediate ban on the use of 500, 1,000, 5,000 and 10,000 dollar notes due to their very low usage.
- •1972: The then Soviet Union conducted an underground nuclear test.
- •1976: The Democratic Party of America declared Jimmy Carter as its presidential candidate.
- •1976: Abolition of capital punishment in Canada.
- •1979: America conducted its nuclear test.
- •1987: 37 years of military rule in Taiwan ended.
- •1992: The Lok Sabha passes a bill seeking to confer on the President the powers of the Legislature of J&K.
- •1996: Veerappan, Sandalwood smuggler, declared 'proclaimed offender'.
- •1996: The United States started sending arms to Pakistan under the Brown Amendment.
- •1997: Eleventh Presidential election with K.R.Narayanan and T.N. Seshan as candidates; 732 out of 775 MPs and 3893 out of 4058 MLAs cast their ballots.
- •1997: India finishes third in Asian women's weightlifting.
- •1998: India is elected chairperson of the World Intellectual Property Organisation's standing panel on information technology in relation to Intellectual Property Rights.
- •1999: Arvind Dave is appointed Governor of Arunachal Pradesh.
- •1999: Makri Morita was appointed Prime Minister of Papua New Guinea.
- •2003: Yelena Isinbayeva of Russia set a new world record in women's pole vault.
- •2007: Palestine Prime Minister Salam Fayyad resigned from his post.
- •2014: The Egyptian government proposed a ceasefire to end the ongoing violence between Israel and Gaza.
- •2014: The Church of England voted in favor of appointing women as bishops.
- •2015: NASA's New Horizon became the first spacecraft to visit Pluto.
