Important events of July 15

- •1588: A war broke out between the British Navy and the Spanish Navy in the English Channel.
- •1662: At the second meeting, Sir Robert Moray announced that the King approved of the gatherings, and a royal charter was signed on 15 July 1662 which created the "RoyalSociety of London", with Lord Brouncker serving as the first president.
- •1783: Sir Jamsetjee Jeejeebhoy, great Indian Merchant, Industrialist and philanthropist, was born in Bombay. He aided famine relief, financed public works like wells, roads, causeways and bridges; founded dispensaries and hospitals; established educational institutions and scholarship funds; etc. He was the recipient of a Knighthood and many medals.
- •1788: Ghulam Kadir, the infamous son of Jabita Khan, conquered Delhi.
- •1795: 'La Marseillaise' was declared the national anthem of France.
- •1864: In America, in 1864, a passenger train loaded with prisoners collided with a coal train, killing 65 out of 955 people and injuring 109.
- •1902: Judge K. Subba Rao, Chief Justice of Supreme Court of India, was born.
- •1903: Kumaraswamy Kamraj, great freedom fighter, social reformer, political leader and member of the Lok Sabha, was born in a trading family at Virudhunagar in Tamil Nadu.
- •1904: Mogubai Kurdikar, veteran singer of 'Jaipur Gharana', was born.
- •1904: The first Buddhist temple was built in Los Angeles, America.
- •1910: Emil Kraepelin named Alzheimer's disease after Alois Alzheimer.
- •1916: The world's largest aerospace company Boeing started.
- •1916: Boeing, the world's largest aerospace company, started today.
- •1917: Tukaram Tanaji Sawant, educationist and famous Hindi writer, was born at Pokhara, (Maharashtra).
- •1920: Earthquake in Delhi.
- •1923: The Italian Parliament accepted the new constitution.
- •1926: The first motor bus route started and ran between Afghan Church and Crawford Market, Mumbai.
- •1927: Vienna Massacre: Austrian police killed 89 demonstrators.
- •1932: America's 31st President Hoover cut his salary by 15 percent.
- •1936: Hridayanand 'Kumaresh' Tiwari, great Hindi poet and writer, was born in Reoti, U.P.
- •1944: During the Second World War, the US Army started large-scale bombing of Japan.
- •1948: US President Harry S Truman was elected for the second term.
- •1948: Establishment of 'PEPS' (Patiyala and East Punjab States Union).
- •1955: First President Dr. Rajendra Prasad announced to give the highest civilian honor Bharat Ratna to the then Prime Minister of the country Jawaharlal Nehru.
- •1961: Spain accepted equal rights for men and women.
- •1962: Algeria became a part of the Arab League.

- •1967: Narayan Shripad Rajhans (Balgandharv), famous singer and actor, passed away.
- •1968: Commercial air service between the US and the then Soviet Union began.
- •1969: Air Chief Marshal Arjan Singh, Padma Vibhushan, DFC. retired as the Air Officer Commanding, India Command. After retirement he was appointed as the Ambassador in Switzerland.
- •1970: Denmark won the first Women's World Cup football by defeating Italy 2-0.
- •1979: Morarji Desai resigns as PM. Jagjivan Ram was elected Janata Parliamentary party leader.
- •1980: Gajanan Vishwanath Ketkar, editor of `Kesari' and `Maratha', passed away.
- •1983: Armenian extremists bombed Orly, France, killing eight people and injuring 54.
- •1984: Punjab was declared a terrorist affected area after the Sikh community in Punjab became restless.
- •1986: India protests against China's intrusion of six to seven km into the Indian territory in Arunachal Pradesh.
- •1986: Sandhya Agarwal made 190 runs in third Women's Test Cricket setting a new record in England.
- •1987: Rajiv Gandhi, Congress President, expels V. C. Shukla, Arif Mohammed Khan and Arun Nehru from Congress for anti-party activities.
- •1991: The 25-day-old Narasimha Rao government wins a vote of confidence in Lok Sabha by securing 241 to 111; 112 abstained.
- •1991: Jagannathrao Joshi, veteran leader of Janata Party `Karnataka Kesri', died.
- •1991: US troops left northern Iraq.
- •1992: Lucknow High Court stays any construction activity near the disputed temple in Ayodhya.
- •1993: JD (A)'s Ajit Singh pegs his group's support to the government on PM's appearance before the JPC.
- •1993: Maninderjit Singh Bitta, Punjab Minister of State for Irrigation, appointed new Youth Cong (I) President.
- •1996: Prince Charles and Diana applied for their divorce.
- •1997: Famous Italian fashion designer Gianni Versace was shot dead.
- •1997: Mahesh Chander Mehta, Environmental activist, wins Ramon Magsaysay Award.
- •1999: China announced the acquisition of the capability of a neutron bomb.
- •2000: All Indian soldiers held hostage in Sierra Leone were freed through military action.
- •2000: The Maharashtra Government gives the green signal to police to proceed against Shiv Sena Chief Bal Thackeray for his alleged role in the 1992-93 Mumbai communal riots.
- •2000: All Indian soldiers hostage freed by military operations in Sierra Leone.
- •2002: American journalist Daniel Pearl's murderer Omar Sheikh was sentenced to death by a Pakistani court.
- •2004: Nepal's Prime Minister accepted foreign mediation in talks with the Maoists.
- •2005: Sri Lanka's Supreme Court suspended the government-LTTE agreement on distribution of tsunami relief material.
- •2008: An agreement was reached between the two major leftist parties in Nepal in 2008 on the appointments of the country's first President and Vice President and the formation of a new government.
- •2011: India successfully placed the modern communication satellite GSAT-12 in space orbit by a polar satellite launch vehicle PSLV.
- •2011: After Nano, Tata Group announced to give houses for 32 thousand rupees.
- •2012: 40 pilgrims died in a bus accident in Parsi, Nepal.
- ullet 20 people were killed and 100 others were injured due to the derailment of a train in Moscow.
- •2020: Twitter accounts of prominent politicians, CEOs, and celebrities were hacked to promote the Bitcoin scandal.
