Important events of July 19

- •1309: Saint Visoba Khechar, was the yogi-guru of the Varkari poet-saint Namdev of Maharashtra, took Samadhi.
- •1333: The Battle of Halidon Hill took place during the Scottish War of Independence in which the English won a decisive victory over the Scots.
- •1510: 38 Jews were burnt alive in Berlin, Prussia.
- •1553: 15-year-old Lady Jane Grey was deposed as Queen of England after nine days.
- •1702: The Swedish army led by King Charles captured the city of Cracow in the Czech Republic.
- •1763: The Nawab of Bengal Mir Qasim was badly defeated by the British army in the Battle of Katwa.
- •1832: The British Medical Association was founded as the Provincial Medical and Surgical Association by Sir Charles Hastings at a meeting in the BoardRoom of the Worcester Infirmary.
- •1836: Charles Darwin reached the city of Ascension in Mexico.
- •1848: The first woman's rights convention was held in Seneca Falls, New York.
- •1864: In the Taiping Rebellion, the Chinese Empire finally defeated Taiping in the Third Battle of Nanking.
- •1870: France declared war against Prussia.
- •1900: The first metro train ran in Paris, the capital of France. The world's first metro service had started in London.
- •1916: In the Battle of Fromelles in the First World War, the British and Australian forces attacked the German army.
- •1925: Dinesh Singh, freedom fighter and politician, was born at Kalakankar (U.P).
- •1926: In France, the second government was formed under the leadership of Edward Herriot.
- •1938: Jayant Vishnu Narlikar, great Indian space scientist and mathematician, was born at Kolhapur, Maharashtra.
- •1940: Adolf Hitler ordered Great Britain to surrender.
- •1941: British Prime Minister Winston Churchill started the 'V for Victory' campaign.
- •1943: During the Second World War, 500 allied forces invaded Rome.
- •1949: Raja of Tehri Garhwal announces merger with Indian Union.
- •1969: The Indian government nationalized 14 major commercial banks.
- •1952: India all out 82 in 2nd innings after making 52 runs earlier in the day.
- •1955: Roger Michael Humphery Binny, Indian medium-pace all-rounder early eighties, was born at Bangalore.
- •1961: For the first time, a film was shown in an airplane.
- •1963: *Joy Walker became the first person to go to space via airplane.*
- •1967: America launched 'Explorer-35' to enter lunar orbit.

- •1969: Apollo II astronauts Neil Armstrong and Edwin Aldrin stepped out of the spacecraft and walked in the orbit of the moon.
- •1969: Indian Government nationalized 14 major commercial banks of India by Presidential ordinance.
- •1974: The remains of Indian revolutionary Udham Singh were brought from London to New Delhi.
- •1974: The ashes of Indian revolutionary Udham Singh were brought from London to New Delhi.
- •1976: Sagarmatha National Park in Nepal was created.
- •1979: The people's revolution of Nicaragua was successful.
- •1987: Rajiv Gandhi, Congress President, expels V.P. Singh from Congress and orders probe into Ajitabh Bachhan's property abroad.
- •1990: Planning Commission decides to make changes in the Gadgil formula for central assistance to States in consultation with states.
- •1993: Girilal Jain, senior journalist, passed away.
- •1994: The Tamil Nadu Bill for continuance of the 69\% reservation policy in the state receives the President's assent.
- •1995: An agreement was signed between Russia and the breakaway republic of Chechnya to grant it the status of a 'sovereign republic' within the Russian Federation.
- •1997: The Irish Republican Army announced a ceasefire for the second time in three years, which was to come into effect from the afternoon of July 20.
- •1998: The INSAT-2C satellite suffers ``disorientation" loss of earth lock briefly.
- •1998: Tremors measuring 4.4 on the Richter scale rocked Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh.
- •2000: The Centre has no locus standi in Thackeray case, says the Prime Minister and rejects the resignations of Shiv Sena nominees in the Union Cabinet-- Manohar Joshi, Suresh Prabhu and Balasaheb Vikhe-Patil.
- •2001: Nepal's Prime Minister Girija Prasad Koirala resigned from his post.
- •2001: Import of 30 items including cards, lipstick, nail polish and chess has been banned in Afghanistan.
- •2003: Russian cosmonaut Yuri Male Thanko became the first person to get married in space.
- •2004: After being postponed thrice, Ariane-5 took off from Kourou launch center in French Guiana carrying the world's largest telecommunication satellite.
- •2005: Prime Minister Manmohan Singh addressed the US Congress.
- •2006: 55 people including 3 Indians were killed in an Israeli attack in Lebanon.
- •2007: Marine Corporal Trent Thomas, an American soldier in Iraq, was convicted of killing 11 disabled children.
- •2007: Pratibhatai Patil became the First Woman President of India.
- •2008: The US tested a long-range missile capable of hitting a target in the Pacific Ocean.
