#### **Important events of July 4**

- •1698: Britain's Thomas Savory obtained the patent for the first commercial steam engine.
- •1751: Swedish chemist and mine expert Frederic Kronsthaler succeeded in discovering a metal called nickel.
- •1760: The Maratha army captured Delhi.
- •1760: Mir Jafar's son Miran died due to lightning strike on the banks of the Gandak River.
- •1776: Representatives of 13 states of America signed the declaration of independence of this country in Philadelphia city. That is why this day is known as America's independence.
- •1778: Persia declared war against Argentina.
- •1789: Agreement made between British East India Company, Peshwa of Pune, and Nizam of Hyderabad to attack Tipu Sultan territory.
- •1819: America's first savings bank 'Bank of Savings in New York' was started.
- •1838: In Britain, 26 children died in the Haskar coal mine accident.
- •1865: The famous English novel Alice in Wonderland was published.
- •1879: Freedom fighter Basudev Balwant Phadke was arrested.
- •1884: Stock exchange Dow Jones published its first stock index.
- •1886: Canada's first transcontinental train reached Port Moody in British Columbia.
- •1886: The New York Tribune was the first newspaper to use a printing machine.
- •1890: Idaho became the 43rd state of America.
- •1897: *Italian scientist Marconi patented the radio in London.*
- •1903: Dorothy Levitt became the first English woman to compete in a motor race.
- •1914: The Battle of Verdun ended.
- •1928: The first color TV programme was broadcast in London.
- •1934: Leo Gillard patented the chain reaction of the atomic bomb.
- •1946: The Philippines gained independence from the United States.
- •1947: The Indian Independence Bill was proposed in front of the British Parliament. Under which the country was divided into India and Pakistan.
- •1952: The US Congress approved the constitution of Puerto Rico.
- •1962: The President of France declared the independence of Algeria.
- •1968: The pressure to stop the war on Vietnam increased after the figures of American soldiers killed in the war were released.
- •1970: An airplane with 105 passengers went missing in Spain.
- •1971: Jim Morrison, the famous singer of American rock band 'The Doors', was found dead in his Paris
- •1979: The construction of Vidyasagar Setu, famous in Kolkata as the second Howrah Bridge, began.
- •1990: 1,426 Haj pilgrims died in a stampede in the tunnel going from Mecca to Mina.
- •1996: Russian President Boris Yeltsin was re-elected President for four years.

- •1997: NASA's Pathfinder landed on Mars.
- •1998: Jana Navotna of the Czech Republic won the Wimbledon tennis singles title.
- •1998: Japan sent its first interplanetary mission named 'Planet-B' in 1998 to gain information about Mars.
- •1998: A British powerboat 'The Cable and Wireless Adventurer' broke the record of fastest round the world tour by completing the journey in 74 days 20 hours and 38 minutes.
- •1999: Indian Army recaptured Tiger Hill.
- •1999: Paes and Bhupathi won the men's doubles title at Wimbledon.
- •2001: *India issued instructions to release Pakistani citizens (prisoners).*
- •2003: 44 people were killed in the 2003 attack on a Shia mosque in Pakistan.
- •2005: A new species of dolphin, the snubfin, was discovered in Australia.
- •2005: Mahesh Bhupathi and Mary Pierce won the Wimbledon tennis mixed doubles title.
- •2007: According to the website Sentido Common, Carlos Slim of Mexico became the richest person in the world.
- •2008: After almost eight years, the first flight of regular direct flight between mainland China and Taiwan landed at Taoyuan International Airport in Taiwan.
- •2010: eight attackers attacked a professor and chopped off his hands for allegedly insulting Prophet Muhammad in an exam paper.
- •2011: Novak Djokovic became the champion in the men's category and Petra Kvitova in the women's category in the Wimbledon Open Grand Slam.
- •2012: 25 killed, 40 injured in a bomb blast in Iraq.
- •2013: The Egyptian army overthrew President Mohammed Morsi.
