#### **Important events of July 5**

- •1658: Mughal ruler Aurangzeb imprisoned his elder brother Murad Bakhsh.
- •1924: Military revolt took place in Sao Paulo, Brazil.
- •1945: Labour Party won the parliamentary elections of Britain.
- •1947: Indian Independence Act 1947 was presented in the British Parliament which later got royal assent.
- •1954: BBC made the first television broadcast. Its duration was 20 minutes and it was prepared in advance.
- •1954: Andhra Pradesh High Court was established.
- •1962: 96 people died in the massacre in Oran, Algeria.
- •1968: India's first submarine arrived from Soviet Russia.
- •1975: 31-year-old American tennis player Arthur Ashe was the first black man to win the Wimbledon singles competition.
- •1977: The Pakistani army, under the leadership of General Zia-ul-Haq, seized power in the country.
- •1977: Prime Minister Bhutto was deposed and arrested in the military coup in Pakistan, and General Zia-ul-Haq assumed power there.
- •1981: Rajan Mahadevan created a world record by calculating 31,811 digits of the mathematical number 'pi'.
- •1994: The formal beginning of Palestinian self-rule in Israel-occupied Jericho took place in 1994.
- •1996: A team of researchers at Scotland's Roslin Institute cloned a cell taken out of a mammalian organism for the first time in 1996.
- •1997: Martina Hingis, a 16-year-old from Switzerland, defeated Yana Novotna of the Czech Republic to win the women's singles title at Wimbledon.
- •1998: *Pete Sampras won the Wimbledon singles title for the fifth time.*
- •1998: The anti-tank missile Nag was successfully tested.
- •1998: *Dolphin City was inaugurated in Tamil Nadu.*
- •1999: The United States announced a ban on the Taliban.
- •2000: The Shanghai-5 countries conference began in Dushanbe (Kazakhstan).
- •2001: Bulgaria's Prime Minister Ivan Kostov resigned from his post after losing the election.
- •2002: 10 people were injured in a bomb blast at the headquarters of the Nepali Congress Party in Kathmandu.
- •2004: Greece made history by winning the Euro Cup football tournament.
- •2004: The first presidential election in Indonesia was held.
- •2007: 60 people died in a landslide in Mexico's southern province of Tabla.
- •2008: Nepal's interim cabinet passed a proposal to bring a bill for constitutional amendment.
- •2009: Switzerland's Roger Federer won the Wimbledon title by defeating Andy Roddick.

•2013: 15 people died in a bomb attack on a mosque in Iraq's capital Baghdad.
