Important events of July 8

- •1283: The Battle of Malta took place.
- •1497: Vasco da Gama left Europe with a crew of 170 members to reach India by sea.
- •1693: New York Police uniforms were approved.
- •1833: Russia and Turkey signed a protection treaty.
- •1856: Charles Byrne received a US patent for a machine gun.
- •1858: After the fall of Gwalior Fort, Lord Canning declared peace.
- •1889: The American newspaper The Wall Street Journal began publication.
- •1918: The Montagu-Chelmsford Report was published to reform the Indian Constitution.
- •1932: The US stock index Dow Jones reached a Great Depression low of 41 points.
- •1948: Recruitment of women in the US Air Force started.
- •1954: Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru inaugurated the world's largest canal, Bhakra-Nangal hydroelectric project in Punjab.
- •1958: An Indian film 'Do Ankhen Barah Hath' won Best Picture at the World Film Festival in Berlin.
- •1975: Thousands of temples were destroyed and there was huge loss of life and property in the earthquake that struck Bagan, Myanmar.
- •1992: Thomas Klestil became the President of Austria.
- •1994: Shimaki Mukai became Japan's first female astronaut.
- •1997: The North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) invited Poland, Hungary, and the Czech Republic to join the organization.
- •1999: Papua New Guinea (Pacific Ocean country) Prime Minister Bill Scott resigns.
- •2002: Quota system for black cricketers ended in South Africa.
- •2003: A Sudan Airways plane crashed, killing all 116 passengers on board.
- •2003: In Iran, two sisters, Laleh and Ladan Bijani, who were joined at the head, died after an operation to separate them failed.
- •2005: An agreement was reached among the G8 countries on the issue of climate change.
- •2008: The Paris government proposed to grant honorary citizenship to controversial Bangladeshi writer Taslima Nasreen.
- •2012: The devastating flood in Assam in 2012 killed more than 500 wild animals, including 13 rhinoceroses from the world famous Kaziranga National Park.
- •2012: A car bomb blast in Kandahar province of Afghanistan killed 14 civilians.
- •2013: 42 people died in army firing on protesting protesters in Egypt's capital Cairo.
- •2014: Miroslav Klose of Germany football team created the world record of scoring maximum 16 goals in the 2014 World Cup.
