Important events of July 9

- •1746: French sailor's fleet reached the bank of Pondicherry in India.
- •1755: E Braddock, British General, was mortally wounded during the French & Indian War.
- •1815: The first natural gas well in America was discovered.
- •1816: The South American country Argentina gained independence from Spain.
- •1852: In the Canadian city of Montreal, 1100 construction sites were destroyed to ashes in a terrible fire.
- •1873: Henry Albert John Gidney, greatest leader and politician, was born in Igatpuri, Maharashtra.
- •1875: The Bombay Stock Exchange, the first in India, was constructed under the shade of a large banyan tree.
- •1877: The inaugural Wimbledon Championships began.
- •1889: The American newspaper The Wall Street Journal began publication.
- •1893: The first successful open-heart surgery took place on Chicago's South Side by Dr. Daniel Hale Williams. The patient was James Cornish, a young man with a knife wound to the chest from a barroom brawl.
- •1944: Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose accepted the leadership of Azad Hind Fauj to liberate India from British rule.
- •1951: India's first Five Year Plan prepared and published. There was the first amendment to the Constitution and the first general elections were held.
- •1969: India accepted 'Royal Bengal Tiger' as its National Animal, as recommended by the Indian Wild life Board. This Tiger is also known as the majestic tiger panthera tigris (Linnaeus).
- •1969: Sagi Lakshmi Venkatapathy Raju, cricketer (Indian slow left-armer), was born in Hyderabad.
- •1972: The Soviet Union conducted underground nuclear tests.
- •1973: As representative of the British Queen, Prince Charles spent his last night in the 300-year-old colony of the Bahamas.
- •1979: Janardhan Gnanoba Navle, cricketer, 2 Tests for India as WK and 1 catch, passed away.
- •1982: Margaret Thatcher started her second term as Prime Minister of Britain on 09 July 1982.
- •1991: South Africa was allowed to participate in the Olympic Games again.
- •1992: The government agrees to set up a Joint Parliamentary Committee to enquire into the security scam.
- •1993: Passport fees raised from Rs. 60 to Rs.300.
- •1994: Surendranath, Governor of Punjab, died.
- •1995: 17 Indian mountaineers reached Jogambha in the Garhwal Himalayas.
- •1996: A Delhi court summoned former Prime Minister Narsimha Rao to face trial as an accused in the Lakhubhai Pathak cheating case in which godman Chandraswami was already facing trial.
- •1999: Ashok Mitra (82), noted writer, academician and former bureaucrat, died in Calcutta.
- •2000: India clinches the inaugural Asian Cricket Council under-15 championship in Kuala Lumpur.

- •2000: An agreement was concluded between George Speight and military leaders in Fiji.
- •2001: India announced the establishment of two posts on the Pakistan border.
- •2002: The name of the Organization of African Unity was changed to African Union.
- •2002: The African Union was established in Addis Ababa, the capital of Ethiopia.
- •2002: South African President Thabo Mbeki first became President.
- •2004: The Asian Development Bank created a fund for its 42 member countries to fight terrorism.
- •2006: At least 122 people died when a Shibir Airlines A310 crashed on the runway at Irkutsk airport in Siberia.
- •2007: Indian-origin American scientist Himanshu Jain was awarded the Otto Scott Research Prize for his groundbreaking work in the field of glass science.
- •2008: Iran tested nine long and medium-range missiles.
- •2011: Africa's Sudan was divided into two parts. The southern part became the Republic of South Sudan.

- •1845: Lord Minto II, who was the Viceroy and Governor-General of India from 1905 to 1910, was born.
