- •1858: The Government of India Act 1858 was an Act of the Parliament of the United Kingdom passed on 2 August 1858. British parliament passed the act to handover the administration of India to British Government from East India Company. After the occasion, the Supreme British ruler in India was called 'Viceroy'.
